



La Gazzetta del Mezzogiorno, with over a century old, is one of the oldest Italian newspapers. Born in Bari on 1 November 1887 as the “Corriere delle Puglie”. February 26, 1928, by Raphael Gorjux changes becoming “La Gazzetta del Mezzogiorno”.

La Gazzetta del Mezzogiorno is the daily leader of a territory from the relevant demographic characteristics from the economic point of view, able to speak to the majority of the population, and especially in that part of the most interesting features from the commercial point of view.

Editor in chief is Giuseppe de Tomaso. Today there are 7 editions provincial (Bari, Lecce, Taranto, Brindisi, Capitanata, Basilicata and North Bari).
